PAPER-I- HISTORY OF MEDIEVAL INDIA (1200 A.D. to 1761 A.D.)

3 hrs. Duration

100 Marks

NOTE:- The question paper will consist of two parts. Part-I will comprise of 12 short type questions covering each unit equally. Candidates are required to attempt any 10 questions of 4 marks each. Answer of each question should not exceed 75 words. Part-I will carry 40 marks.

Part-II will be divided into three sections having two essay type questions in each section. Candidates are required to attempt three questions in all selecting one question from each section. All questions will carry equal marks. Part-II will carry 60 marks.

Section-I

- Main Sources of Medieval Indian History
- The Sultanate: consolidation and expansion:- Qutubuddin Aibak; Iltutmish and Balban
- Khalji imperialism:- Allauddin Khilji in Rajputana and Deccan, administrative and economic regulations and their impact on the people.
- Innovations under Muhammad Tughlaq, Religious policy and public works of Firuz Tughlaq; Sikandar Lodi; Vijaynagar empire – its political and cultural achievements.
- Social and economic condition, administrative system during Sultanate period.

Section-II

- Political Condition of India on the eve of Babur's invasion, his role in the establishment of the Mughal empire; Humayun's early difficulties and causes of his failure; Shershah's expansion of empire and administration.
- Expansion and consolidation of the Mughal empire under Akbar and Jahangir, their Rajput Policy.
- Nurjahan's role in the Mughal court; Shahjahan's achievements; Aurangzeb's Policy towards Rajputs and Deccan.

Section-III

- Shivaji-his conquests and administration. Rise of Peshwas and third battle of Panipat (1761).
- Religious policy of the Mughal emperors. Causes of downfall of the Mughal Empire.
- Nature of Mughal state; agrarian system; Mansabdari system; foreign trade and Commerce.
- Social classes- ulema, nobility, zamindars, peasantry, artisans, agricultural labourer and slaves; Status of women.
